ROUND ONE

GRANGE OFFICERS

- 100** This officer determines the right and left sides of the Grange Hall. (OVERSEER)
- 200** This Grange officer carries the Spud. (STEWARD)
- 300** Combined, the Ceres, Pomona and Flora are often referred to as this. (THE GRACES)
- 400** The keys are the emblem of this office. (TREASURER)
- 500** During their installation, this Grange officer is presented a scroll. (LECTURER)

THE "A" TEAM

- 100** This should be placed in a position one-third the distance from Ceres to Overseer, and have the Bible upon it. (ALTAR)
- 200** "Since God placed man on earth, *'this'* has existed. There is no occupation that precedes it,..." (AGRICULTURE)
- 300** This emblem of the First Degree teaches us perseverance, and to overcome every difficulty by repeated trials. (AX)
- 400** Within the Grange, may our friendships be as firm as this colorful stone, the emblem of the Fourth Degree. (AGATE)
- 500** This national observance has its roots in Nebraska, in which the Grange greatly espoused the planting of trees as a way to prevent soil erosion. (ARBOR DAY)

AROUND THE HALL

- 100** Grapes and apples could most likely be found on the station of this officer. (POMONA)
- 200** The number of offices with staves at their stations. (FOUR)
- 300** Grange law prescribes that no Grange can be legally opened without these two items: (AMERICAN FLAG, OPEN BIBLE)
- 400** This official document from the National Grange can often be found framed, and respectfully displayed on a wall or easel. (CHARTER)
- 500** To signify the Grange is open in ample form in the Fourth Degree, the Master opens this item. (IMPLEMENT CASE)

THE JUNIOR GRANGE

- 100** This is considered the official color of the Junior Grange program. (DARK RED)
- 200** It is the third order of business in a Junior Grange meeting. (ROLL CALL OF OFFICERS)
- 300** A native of Texas, she is the National Junior Director, and may be in the room. No pressure....
(SAMANTHA WILKINS)
- 400** While some subordinate Grange officers carry staves, Junior Grange officers carry smaller versions called this. (RODS)
- 500** 2017 National Junior Grange Ambassador Jomni Tarbell calls this state home. (NEW YORK)

"GRANGE... BY THE NUMBERS"

- 100** The number of Grange offices which may only be held by women. (FOUR)
- 200** The number of members needed for a subordinate Grange quorum. (SEVEN)
- 300** After the death of a Grange member, the number of days the charter is traditionally draped.
(THIRTY)
- 400** The number of years Oliver Hudson Kelley served as National Master. (ZERO)
- 500** The number of 'no' votes required to prevent someone from obtaining Grange membership.
(THREE)

ROUND TWO

GRANGE YOUTH DEPARTMENT

- 100** There are this many regional youth conferences every year. (SIX)
- 200** This group of past Grange Royalty, Youth Team members, and National Youth Directors (G.R.O.W. CLUB)
- 300** Even though it's nicknamed the Golden State, this state can claim more youth members than Golden Sheaf members. (CALIFORNIA)
- 400** This youth department award provides a scholarship to the DC Legislative Fly-In (GRASSROOTS ACTIVISM)
- 500** New for 2017, this contest developed in association with the Assembly of Demeter challenges members to become familiar with the Order's unwritten work. (CODE READING)

GRANGE HISTORY

- 100** Meaning "Let it be perpetual", this is the motto of the state of Idaho and is also associated with the National Grange. (ESTO PERPETUA)
- 200** This Grange member created a portrait of National Master Hershel Newsom in 1966. (NORMAN ROCKWELL)
- 300** One of the legislative victories of the National Grange, Rural Free Delivery, is memorialized with a monument in what state? (MICHIGAN)
- 400** Though the first subordinate Grange in this state was organized in 1934, this state gained a delegate to National session in 2004 when the State Grange was organized. (ALASKA)
- 500** These two states are the only ones never to have a single Grange. (UTAH & HAWAII)

NOTABLE WOMEN

- 100** She was the first woman to be elected Master of the National Grange. (BETSY HUBER)
- 200** In addition to being the first National Grange Ceres, she was also the first Lady Assistant Steward. (CAROLINE HALL)
- 300** When failing health led her husband to resign as National Grange Treasurer in 1893, she was elected to continue his work, and would do so for the next 26 years. (EVA McDOWELL)
- 400** A heroine of the women's suffrage movement, her final public appearance was at the National Grange Session of 1903. (SUSAN B. ANTHONY)
- 500** In 1895, Sarah Baird was elected the first Master of this, the first State Grange. (STATE GRANGE OF MINNESOTA)

- 100** CHAPLAIN: “Well done, good and faithful _____” (SERVANTS)
- 200** OVERSEER: “Worthy Steward, you will _____” (ASCERTAIN)
- 300** “I therefore close this Outer Gate in Faith, in Hope and Charity and will guard it with _____.” (FIDELITY)
- 400** “We proclaim it among our purposes to continue our historical appreciation of the abilities and equality of _____” (WOMEN)
- 500** The final Grange Officer to speak before the Master raps the gavel to adjourn meeting. (STEWARD)

FRATERNITY POTPORRI

- 100** This quarterly publication of the National Grange made its debut in the winter of 2017. (GOOD DAY!)
- 200** January 7th, 1868 is considered the first actual session of this, the “Grange of the Founders”, in Washington, D.C. (POTOMAC GRANGE #1)
- 300** Candidates of the Third Degree are referred to as this. (HARVESTERS AND GLEANERS)
- 400** The Declaration of Purposes of the National Grange was adopted in this year. (1875)
- 500** In 1949, this Ohio native was appointed to be the first director of youth activities for the National Grange. (WIB JUSTI)
